Pre-Surgery Instructions

CONTACT INFORMATION:

• The Surgery Center is located at 900 N. Liberty St. Ste 450 Boise, ID 83704.

We are located on the fourth floor of the Liberty Building, take a RIGHT off the elevators into the Surgery Center.

The Surgery Cener will call you the <u>DAY BEFORE</u> your surgery to confirm your arrival time.

WHAT TO BRING:

- A responsible adult to DRIVE YOU HOME & STAY WITH YOU FOR 24 HOURS AFTER SURGERY.
- Photo ID, Insurance Card, & Payment for any deposit or deductible due. Payment is REQUIRED prior to Surgery.
- A complete list of your medications, including over-the-counter vitamins and supplements.
- Any inhalers you use at home.
- A sippy cup or bottle and change of clothes for infants and toddlers.

WHAT TO DO:

- Wear loose, comfy clothes. If you are having nose or sinus surgery, wear a button-up shirt.
- You will be asked to remove all clothing and change into a patient gown upon arrival to the center.
- Do not wear make-up, perfume, or cologne & leave your valuables at home. REMOVE ALL JEWELRY AND PIERCINGS.
- If you wear glasses or contacts, remove your contacts at home and wear glasses.
- For children younger than 18 years of age, one parent or guardian must always remain on-site.
- If you test positive for Covid-19 during the **14 DAYS** prior to your surgery, you will need to reschedule.
- If you experience cold or flu symptoms during the 14 DAYS prior to your surgery, please notify the surgery center.

WHEN TO STOP EATING & DRINKING:

- Stop EATING & DRINKING @ MIDNIGHT, the night before surgery.
 - o Candy, mints, tobacco products, and gum are considered solid foods
- Stop infant and toddler FORMULA 6 HOURS prior to surgery.
 Stop infant and toddler BREAST MILK 4 HOURS prior surgery.

WHAT TO EXPECT:

- Upon admission, you will change into a patient gown, removing all your undergarments.
- Anyone with child-bearing capabilities will be asked to provide a urine sample for pregnancy testing.
- If post-operative pain medication is prescribed, you will receive the prescription upon discharge, it cannot be called into any pharmacy.
- Children undergoing anesthesia may wake up inconsolable and irritable for a period of time.

CAR SEAT SAFETY:

- Anesthesia may cause increased drowsiness for 24 hours. It is best to have two adults accompany your child home so while one adult
 drives, the other may observe the child.
- If your child falls asleep in their car seat, ensure their head/chin has not fallen towards their chest and occluded their airway.
- Ensure they are breathing normally, without difficulty, and without unusual noises.
- Ensure their car seat straps are placed and positioned according to manufacturer instructions, so they are not restricting their airway.
- Place a mirror on the headrest for rear-facing car seats, ensuring you can visualize your child during the entire car ride home.

MEDICATIONS AND SUPPLEMENTS:

CONTINUE TAKING:

- Beta Blockers: Atenolol, Bisoprolol, Carvedilol, Esmolol, Labetalol, Metoprolol, Nadolol, Propanolol, Sotalol
- Calcium Channel Blockers: Amlodipine, Diltiazem, Felodipine, Nicardipine, Verapamil, etc.
- **Psychoactive Medications:** Lorazepam, Clonazepam, Diazepam, Hydroxyzine, Risperidone, Xanax, Klonopin, Valium, Ativan, Buspar, Prozac, Zoloft, Lexapro, Lithium, etc.
- Antidepressants: Amitriptyline, Imipramine, Citalopram, Fluoxetine, Sertraline, etc.
- Anti-Convulsants: Carbamazepine, Lamotrigine, Oxcarbazepine, Topiramate, Levetiracetam, etc.
- Heartburn Medications: Famotidine, Ranitidine, Omperazole, Pantoprazole, Tums, etc.
- Anti-Spasmodics: Baclofen, Cyclobenzaprine, Tizanidine, Carisoprodol, Depakote, Lyrica, Neurontin, Clozapine, etc.
- Narcotics or Pain Medications that you take on a regular basis
- Anti-Arrhythmic, Thyroid Medications, Gout Medications, Parkinson's, Dementia, & MS Medications
- Birth Control Medications
- BPH Medications: Finasteride, Tamsulosine, Terazosin, Dutasteride, etc.
- Cholesterol Medications: Atorvastatin, Simvastatin, Pravastatin, etc.
- Glucocorticoids: Prednisone, Hydrocortisone, Dexamethasone, etc.

DO NOT TAKE MORNING OF SURGERY:

- **Diuretics:** Water pills, Lasix, or any medication with HCTZ
- Anti-Diabetics: Metformin, Glyburide, Glipizide, Avandia, Januvia, Jardiance, etc.
- Rapid & Short Acting Insulins: Regular U-100, Lispro, Aspart, NPH, etc.
- Take HALF your normal Long Acting Insulin dose.
- Ace Inhibitors: Benazepril, Lisinopril, Perindopril, Quinapril, Ramipril, Trandolapril, etc.
- Angiotension II Receptor Blockers: Azilsartan, Candesartan, Irbesartan, Valsartan, Telmisartan, Losartan
- PDE-5 Inhibitors: Sildenafil, Tadalafil, etc.
- Stool Softeners, Laxatives, or Antidiarrheals

STOP 7 DAYS BEFORE SURGERY:

- NSAIDS: Ibuprofen, Advil, Aleve, Motrin, etc.
- All Vitamins, Herbals & Supplements: Vitamin E, Ginko, Garlic, Ginger, Fish Oil, Ginseng, Echinacea, etc.
- GLP-1 Receptor Agonist: Byetta, Trulicity, Ozempic, Wegovy, Semaglutide, Lixisenatide, Liraglutide, Dulaglutide, Mounjaro, etc.

STOP 14 DAYS BEFORE SURGERY:

- Diet or Weight Loss Medications: Phentermine, Dextroamphetamine, Orlistat, Belviq, Contrave, etc.
- MAO Inhibitors: Phenelzine, Selegiline, Tranylcypromine, Isocarboxazid, Pargyline, etc.

ANTI-COAGULANTS:

If you are prescribed any of the following medications by your cardiologist, please HOLD medications for <u>3 DAYS</u> or as indicated by your cardiologist. Please inform your cardiologist of your upcoming surgery for further guidance.

Aspirin, Coumadin, Effient, Eliquis, Plavix, Pradaxa, Xarelto, Saxaysa, Lovenox, Arixtra, etc.
